## Do You Know the Baltimore County Laws Governing Fireworks?

Fireworks are synonymous with the Fourth of July holiday and other Summer celebrations, but these devices are as dangerous as they are beautiful to watch. Fireworks burn at up to 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit and can cause burns, lacerations, amputations and blindness. Fireworks should only be handled by professionals.

With few exceptions, the use of fireworks is illegal in Maryland, unless they are part of a public display for which the State Fire Marshal has granted a permit. Violators who possess or discharge illegal fireworks are subject to a misdemeanor fine of up to \$250.

The Baltimore County Fire Department and the Maryland State Fire Marshal offer these guidelines:

- ★ Hand-held sparklers are legal in Baltimore County if their packaging states that they do not contain chlorates or perchlorates.
- ★ A relatively recent change in Maryland fire laws permits the sale, purchase and use of ground-based sparkler devices in Baltimore County. These are stationary ground-based devices that emit a shower of sparks several feet into the air. The State Fire Marshal provides a complete list of legal, ground-based sparkler devices.
- ★ You must be at least 16 years old to purchase hand-held and ground-based sparklers.
- ★ Hand-held or ground-based devices that create an explosion, detonation, loud noise, that launch a projectile or move along the ground under their own power are illegal in Baltimore County.
- ★ With the exception of hand-held sparklers and ground-based sparkler devices, you cannot have a private display of fireworks at your home. However, you can have a public display with the proper permits and insurance.
- ★ It is illegal to purchase fireworks outside of Maryland and bring them into the state.
- ★ Toy caps are legal, but only if they use 0.25 grams of gunpowder or less and are designed so the hand cannot come into contact with the cap when in use. Do not allow small children to use cap guns.

Laws in other Maryland counties may vary. For information about what is allowed in neighboring jurisdictions, contact the Fire Marshal's office in that jurisdiction.

#### Reminder to Pet Owners

A reminder to everyone that there is a leash law in effect in Baltimore County. Pets are not allowed to roam freely. They may cause traffic problems, be injured by vehicles, or damage neighbor's shrubs and lawns. Additionally, for all those who walk their dogs, Baltimore County requires animal owners to be responsible for the removal of their pet's excreta deposited on public or private property. ## Slow Down for Safety

Summer is upon us. Children are playing outdoors, and lots of folks are walking or biking around the neighborhood. Here are some suggestions for safely enjoying the beauty of Sudbrook Park:

If you are walking or biking in the early morning or after dusk, wear reflective clothing so you will be visible to drivers. Cyclists should have front and rear lights.

PLEASE DRIVE THE SPEED LIMIT OF 25 MPH IN SUDBROOK PARK and in our neighboring communities. Help keep our roads safe for children, pedestrians and cyclists.

Speeding remains a serious problem on many of our streets. It is not unusual to see someone run a stop sign in Sudbrook Park. You can help by reporting traffic violations to the Baltimore County Police iWatch site. Here is the link:

You may choose to enter your name and address, or remain anonymous. Include any information about the driver or vehicle, day, time, and location. The important thing is to let the police know about illegal or unsafe activity.

## Vacation Checklist

The Baltimore County Police remind residents to make a checklist before going on summer vacation.

- Lock all windows and doors. Don't forget the basement.
- Secure all outdoor furniture and grills, or better yet, place them in a garage, shed or basement.
- Lock sheds and garages.
- Set light timers both inside and out. The sun goes down around 8 pm so why not set the timer for 7:30 pm. And if the weather looks a little iffy, set the timer for an earlier time.
- Have a neighbor take in your mail and newspaper. Newspapers littering the front yard are a sure way to tell the world you are away.
- Leave contact info with a neighbor or relative so you can be reached in case of emergency.

**Crime typically increases in the warm weather months.**
